Rules Governing Exhibits

4-H members must be enrolled in the Horse, Horse Equitation, Horseless Horse project.

Any horse showing signs of any infectious disease will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds. Vaccinations are strongly recommended: Eastern/Western, Influenza, Tetanus, Strangles, Rhino and West Nile.

Original proof of Negative Coggins Test and one copy required. Animal(s) must be checked for strangles before unloading from the trailer.

The person(s) bringing the animal(s) in must have the original proof of negative Coggins test, one copy and the 4-H health agreement form including Premise ID number with them.

All Horse exhibitors (including horseless horse) and their horses must participate in two educational programs where the horse is actively “worked” (ridden, led at halter, driven, etc.) with other horses on a premise other than their home farm or place of residence. One of the two educational programs must be an approved core event. This requirement is to be fulfilled between January 1 and the July deadline set by the Fair*. Specific regulations regarding this requirement are available on the 4-H and Horsemasters website/ Facebook page.

- Exhibitors must be enrolled in the 4-H horse/pony project, horseless horse project or FFA.
- Exhibitor’s attitude, conduct, safety reasons, health reasons and/or animal neglect may result in removal from the Fair. Horse Superintendents and Junior Fair Superintendent have the final decision in removal.
- Project animals must be shown by a Junior Fair exhibitor. In the case of a conflict, another Junior Fair exhibitor may show the animal.
- The Fair is intended to be educational, as well as fun. All exhibitors, leaders and parents are expected to be fair and honest in choosing the exhibitor’s entry category.
- Superintendents reserve the right to make the final decisions concerning exhibitor’s entry categories and Divisions.

- Horseless Horse exhibitors: Your 4-H horse buddy and owner will have the final decision regarding your participation at the Fair based on your involvement with the project animal prior to the Fair and safety reasons
- The Herdsmanship meeting will be held Tuesday, 4 p.m., in the beef barn. Corrections to your entries will be taken after the meeting. You will receive your back tags and other important information necessary for participation at the Fair for the week.
- Master Horseman program and Horseless Horse project require pre-registration by July 1st. Forms available at 4-H office, a Horsemasters meeting, or at www.freewebs.com/marathoncountyhorsemasters or on their Facebook page.
- 4-H Horse project, Horseless Horse project or Horse Education project exhibitors will participate in the Horse Masters meeting on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. The meeting location changes occasionally, so check www.freewebs.com/marathoncountyhorsemasters and Facebook.
- Horse project youth are encouraged to attend horse education day, tack swap, clinics, schooling shows, youth and open shows, judging events and other 4-H sponsored events throughout the year

Project Animal Rules

- Project animals must be cared for by the exhibitor as of May 1st of the Fair year.
- Exhibitors may show two pre-registered project animals. Each horse must qualify at two events. Project animals must be pre-registered by May 15. Pre-registration forms will be available at the mandatory April Horsemasters Meeting, 212 River Dr-Wausau.
- No foals, weanlings or stallions will be allowed on Fairgrounds.
- Sign up all horses that you own when you pre-register in case of an injury to your primary project animal. Horses must qualify at two events each.
- Age of project animals is determined as of Jan. 1 of the fair year.
- Grades 12 & Under: Youth and guardian attendance required at the mandatory or make up meeting in order to show at the Wisconsin Valley Fair.

- Team driving counts as one unit, not two horses. You may be in team driving and show another horse or pony.
- A registered project animal must have registration papers. A grade project animal will not.
- All project animals must be identified by a sign indicating exhibitor's name, club/ chapter, project animal name and age, while being housed in the horse barn. These signs are available through your horse project leader or or Extension representative.
- Project animals will be housed in the horse barn, no earlier than Tuesday and must remain through the last Division on Saturday.
- Project animals are to be ridden and lounged only by the exhibitor. Parents, guardians, 4-H leaders, and FFA advisors will be able to assist for safety reasons, but exhibitors must be present during this time.
- No professional trainers or groomers are allowed on the arena rail or to work with/coach the exhibitor, or horse, on the Fairgrounds.
- Hay and bedding will be provided by the exhibitor.

Unloading Procedure

- Project animals will arrive at the Fairgrounds between the hours of 7 a.m. - 3 p.m., Tuesday.
- Exhibitors will be contacted prior to the fair for your stall assignments in the horse barn.
- Horses will be stalled at the Fair, unless approved by the Horse Superintendents and the Junior Fair Superintendent (4-H Youth Development Agent)
- Exhibitors that are expected to "trailer in" will be contacted prior to the Fair by a horse superintendent
- Trailers must be parked down by the arena to unload, not by the horse barn
- Do not unload animals before having them checked. After the forms are handed in and the project animal is checked you may begin to unload the animal, feed and tack, proceeding to the horse barn.
- You must have proof of current negative Coggins test, and one copy, completed health agreement form including Premise ID number at the time the project animal is checked. All forms will be collected at check-in.
- The health agreement form may be found at www.freewebs.com/marathoncountyhorsemasters
- Exhibitors trailering in will be parked by a superintendent, horses will be checked in and forms will be collected. Before leaving for the day, you must be checked out by a superintendent, to assure the grounds are clean of manure and debris.
- Trailers must be removed no later than one hour after the completion of the last Division of the day.

Barn and Arena Rules

- An AST/SEI approved helmet and boots are required to be worn by everyone who is mounted or driving a horse or pony.
- No bareback riding or riding with a halter allowed.
- No cell phones allowed while mounted on horse or pony.
- Back tags will be worn at all times while mounted on a horse or pony.
- A parent, guardian, 4-H leader or FFA advisor must be present for an exhibitor to enter the arena for supervision purposes, whether for practice or showing in Divisions. Contact information must be available.
- Every horse and pony must be exercised daily, when stalled in the horse barn. These times must be supervised by a parent, guardian, 4-H leader, or FFA advisor.
- Horse barn opens at 6 a.m. and closes at 9:30 p.m.
- Only cordless clippers allowed
- Fans allowed if approved by Fair electrician, Junior Fair Superintendent, or Grounds Superintendent.
- No lip chains or twitches allowed.

Show Rules

- The Wisconsin Valley Fair uses the state 4-H show rules and guidelines for Performance Divisions and Gymkhana Divisions. These are available at: <http://uwex.edu/ces/4h>
- Check show bills for final Class listing. They will be available in July at: www.freewebs.com/marathoncountyhorsemasters
- When signing up for Classes, be sure to enter all the Classes you may possibly want to participate in during the Fair on ShoWorks.
- If an exhibitor has a conflict with showing in another project Department, they must report this conflict well before the conflicting horse Class is to be held. This exhibitor will be allowed to show separately, or in another Class, but will be judged according to their category.
- Exhibitors must check in for their Class with the in-gate person well before that Class is going in to be judged.
- To maintain a safe environment, Superintendents will split classes into manageable size using the grade of the exhibitor to create the division.

Entry Categories

- **Horseless Horse:** Category is available to youth for up to 2 years. Exhibitor does not own, lease, or manage a horse/pony. Horseless Horse exhibitors are able to use a horse/pony that is also shown by another exhibitor. Exhibitor must be working with the animal for no less than three months prior to the fair. **Walk/Trot only, no exceptions.** Exhibitors are eligible to qualify for Horseless Horse opportunities at the Wisconsin 4-H Horse Show.
- **Novice:** (This is a combination of the areas known as Pet Horse, Pre-novice, Novice, and Intermediate in the past.) It is for the youth who has not been showing in a circuit type of situation. These Divisions are for the 4-H exhibitor (and project animal) who have never shown, or has never won a blue ribbon in a regular showmanship, horsemanship, equitation, pleasure, trail, hunter hack, driving, halter or gymkhana Division. (The only exception would be Marathon County 4-H shows and prior Wisconsin Valley or Athens Fairs.) Exhibitor and project animal do not have to have precise showmanship or horsemanship skills. They will be judged on cleanliness, fitness, health, and ability to handle animal. Walk/Trot or Walk/Trot/Canter—No cross entering.
- **Grade Categories:** Grade 6 and under, and grades 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13. Walk/Trot/Canter. Grades 6 and up will be eligible to qualify for the Wisconsin 4-H Horse Show.
- **Therapeutic:** (all grades) Each competitor shall be an enrolled 4H or Horseless Horse member. Youth will be judged in separate leadline Divisions, with accommodations to insure the safety of the rider and horse. Each exhibitor shall provide, at the time entry form is submitted, the following: (1) a physician's signature stating the rider is allowed to participate in equine activities; (2) a statement from the therapeutic riding instructor or physical therapist that the rider has worked with; indicating the lead length and/or the number of side walkers required (if at all); (3) written permission from the parents/guardian for participation in the show. Parent should contact the Jr. Fair superintendent in writing, (at 212 River Drive, Wausau, WI 54403) requesting participation in these Divisions, if the youth has special needs, due to cognitive or physical capacity. Exhibitor cannot enter any other Division. Lead person/persons must be 18 years or older. Walk/Trot only.

Grand and Reserve Champion Awards

The top two (2) blue ribbon horses and/or ponies, in all categories (except Pre-novice, Novice & Pet Horse) are eligible to compete for the Grand & Reserve Champion Awards.

The following Divisions qualify:

- Division A-Showmanship
- Division B-Horsemanship and Equitation,
- Division C-English and Western Pleasure
- Division D-Halter

- Hunter Hack exhibitors must submit an approved jumping form at the herdsmanship meeting, Tuesday, 4 p.m. The maximum jump height will be no more than 18" at the center of the fence. This form is available at the Extension office, Horsemasters meetings, superintendents, and at www.freewebs.com/marathon-countyhorsemasters.
- Showmanship, Horsemanship, Equitation and Reinsmanship Divisions will be judged under the Danish system. Pleasure, Halter, Trail and Gymkhana will be judged under the regular system. Exhibitors will be paid only for their top two Divisions: one from Showmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship or Reinsmanship; one from Pleasure, or Halter. If an exhibitor shows two horses or ponies, they will be paid for the top four Divisions. Premiums will be awarded in Divisions A-D. Divisions E-H will be awarded ribbons only.
- To be eligible for state aid, an exhibitor may enter one Showmanship Division per horse or pony, plus one of the following: Pleasure, Halter, Horsemanship, or Reinsmanship.
- Costume and Egg and Spoon Division will run for ribbons only.
- The top two blue ribbon exhibitors from Grade Category Divisions will compete for Grand and Reserve Champion awards in: Showmanship, Halter, English Equitation, English Pleasure, Pony English Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Western Pleasure and Pony Western Pleasure
- Horseless Horse exhibitors will compete for the Joanne Booth Overall Grand Champion Memorial Award. This will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points combined from all pleasure and all speed Divisions. To be eligible, a youth must compete in one Showmanship Division and one Horsemanship or Equitation Division. Divisions that qualify are: Showmanship, English Equitation, Hunter Hack, Western Horsemanship, Driving, Trail, Costume, Plug Race, LT Special, Barrel Race, Pole Bending, Flag Race, Speed and Action, and Keyhole. All grade categories will be combined.
- Horseless Horse exhibitors will compete for the Grand and Reserve Pleasure awards. This will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points combined from all pleasure Divisions. To be eligible, a youth must compete in one Showmanship or Halter Division or one Horsemanship or Equitation Division. Divisions that qualify are: Showmanship, Halter, English Equitation, Hunter Hack, Western Horsemanship, Driving, Trail and Costume. All grade categories will be combined. Only one horse and rider combination will be eligible.
- Horseless horse and novice exhibitors will compete for the Overall Grand Champion, and the Overall Reserve Champion speed award. These awards will be awarded to the exhibitors with the highest number of points combined from the following Divisions: Showmanship, English Equitation, English Pleasure, Hunter Hack, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Driving, Trail, Costume, Plug Race, LT Special, Barrel Race, Pole Bending, Flag Race, Speed and Action, and Keyrace. All grade categories will be combined. To be eligible, a youth must compete in one Showmanship Division and one Horsemanship or Equitation Division.
- Gymkhana exhibitors will compete for the Overall Grand Champion award and the Overall Reserve Champion award in Senior, Intermediate and Junior categories. These awards will be awarded to the exhibitors with the highest number of points combined from all speed Divisions from their grade category. Divisions that qualify are: Plug Race, LT Special, Barrel Race, Pole Bending, Flag Race, Speed and Action, and Keyrace. Only one horse and rider combination will be eligible.
- Trail exhibitors will compete for the Overall Grand Champion award and the Overall Reserve Champion award in Senior, Intermediate and Junior categories
- Driving exhibitors will compete for the Margo Budnik Overall Driving Grand Champion award. The Judge will decide the recipient of this award. All driving Divisions will count towards this award.
- The VFW Sportsmanship, Herdsmanship and Judging awards will be presented at Sunday's awards ceremony, 3 p.m. in the beef barn. A horse project awards picnic is planned following the Fair. Additional awards will be given at that time.
- To qualify for the Wisconsin State 4-H Expo show in September, exhibitors must be a 4-H member grade 6 and over and receive a blue ribbon in one of the following Divisions: Showmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, Driving, Pleasure, Trail, Horseless Horse, or Therapeutic. The form exhibitors need to participate in the State 4-H Expo show and State 4-H Gymkhana will be available during the Fair. (4Hers do not have to qualify to compete at State Gymkhana)
- The State 4-H Expo meeting will be held on Sunday of the Fair. This meeting will be held at 2 p.m. in the same area as Hippology contest. Youth must attend with a parent/guardian. Youth must bring completed Expo or Gymkhana forms along with Coggins test report (copy not original) and check for fees made payable to: Wisconsin State 4-H Association. All those sending educational entries only also must attend and bring completed entry form, check and parent/guardian. All forms need to be turned in at the meeting.

Entry Categories

- **Horseless Horse:** Category is available to youth for up to 2 years. Exhibitor does not own, lease, or manage a horse/pony.
