Rules Governing Exhibits

Open to 4-H members enrolled in the Knitting, Crocheting Projects or FCCLA members.

All items will be judged face-to-face on Tuesday, 10 a.m. - 7 p.m. Judges will break for lunch at noon.

- Exhibits must be work of exhibitors during current year
- Articles can be worn before Fair, but must be clean and in good condition when brought to Fair or will be dropped one ribbon placement or disqualified
- Articles consisting of more than one piece should be pinned or tied together. Precaution should be taken so entry tag won't get misplaced (pin on article).

Knitting and Clothing Revue

- Entries will be judged prior to fair. Contact 4-H office for date and location.
- Judging is face-to-face and based on the following:
 - Suitability of garment or individual purpose as to color and design
 - General appearance, neatness and fit
 - Not more than one entry per Division, except when garment is made for another individual and is modeled by that individual
- All participants must model at the Fair to be eligible for premiums.
- Knitted entries (must be enrolled in project Knitting and Crocheting, Cloverbuds, Exploring or be an FCCLA member)
