

### 1. I'm not enrolled in 4-H, can I still attend?

Yes. This event is open to all youth and adults who wish to learn more about a 4-H project area(s) such as arts, photography, chickens, biking. No participant is required to be enrolled in 4-H, but additional health/emergency forms may be necessary. ### 2. What should I expect for the Project Discovery Day?

Project Discovery Day classes will be 45-minute hands-on sessions led by presenters knowledgeable on the given topic--either 4-H volunteers, members, staff or members of the public. For 2020, all classes will be held indoors. Check-in will take place by the main door, and evaluation surveys will be distributed at the end of the session.

### 3. Do I have to attend all 3 sessions?

No. Each of the sessions are stand alone and optional. The classes have been scheduled to allow attendees the ability to attend multiple sessions. The check-in table will be staffed during the duration of the event. Note, that V.I.P. Training takes up two sessions (1.5 hours--Session 2 and 3).

### 4. How do I pay my class fee?

Most Project Discovery Day classes are free. If there is a fee noted, these can be paid at the door on February 22. Payment can be either cash or check made out to UW-Extension.

### 5. How will I be notified if the class is canceled?

Participants will be notified if the classes are held on February 17. If there is a National Weather statement indicating travel is not advised, communication will be emailed and texted to participants, and it will be posted on the Extension Marathon County website and social media at least 12 hours before the event.

### 6. Is this event mandatory?

No. This is an additional learning opportunity supported by Extension Marathon County and the 4-H Leaders Federation. It can be a great way to fulfill volunteer requirements and/or project meetings.
