# Woodland Owners Classes

Marathon County has a total of 469,702 forested acres, which accounts for 47% of the land cover. In the state, 57% of the forested lands are owned and managed by family forest owners. In Marathon County, that comes down to over 3,000 landowners making decisions about their woodland. And we know the importance of forest products in this state. Very few landowners have worked with a forester, and fewer yet have a management plan for this important and valuable resource.

To help landowners understand the value of their resource and working with a professional, Extension provides classes for woodland owners across the state. This October, classes will be held in Marathon Co. The three classes offered in this series include: conducting a timber sale, managing for wildlife habitat, and family conversations about the future of the woodlands. 
#### Soil Testing - Why, When, and How
