You can enroll in 4-H! 4-H Enrollment opens on September 1st. For you to get the most out of the year, please complete your enrollment by November 1st. You must be enrolled by June 1st to be eligible to show at that years Wisconsin Valley Fair.

LOGGING IN TO AN EXISTING 4-H ONLINE ACCOUNT


- 1. If you had an account in the previous year, go to http://wi.4honline.com.
- 2. Enter your email address and password.
- 3. Click Sign-In

If you have forgotten your password, click "Reset Password?" to receive an email with a link to set a new password.

- 4. You will be at the Family Member List Screen.
- 5. To re-enroll a youth member, click on Enroll Now and skip to Youth Member Enrollment.
- 6. To re-enroll an adult member, click on Enroll Now and skip to Adult Enrollment.
- 7. To add a new youth or adult member, click on the Add Member button and skip to Adding a New Member to the Family.

Creating a New 4-H Online Account

- 1. Go to http://wi.4honline.com.
- 2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4-H Online.
- 3. Select Wisconsin from the drop-down menu and then select Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development.
- 4. Choose your county from the drop-down menu.
- 5. Complete your family's information.
- 6. Click the Create Account button.
- 7. Enter your family's address information.
- 8. Click the Verify button.


NOTE: The verification process may require you to select an appropriate USPS format.

If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click the Confirm button and continue to log in with an Existing 4-H Online Account.

Project Guide

A 4-H project is an area you want to learn more about during the 4-H year. Projects are used to help connect youth members with adult leaders who are knowledgeable in the project. There are projects on just about any topic you would like to study and explore, from art to woodworking, from computers to rabbits, from clothing to small engines.

On these pages, you will find descriptions for statewide projects, internet resources and links of interest, county fair exhibit suggestions, state specialist contacts, and other suggested 4-H resources.









How to Select 4-H Projects

4-H members . . .

- 1. Make a list of the things you like to do or want to learn more about.
 - Talk over your list with your parents, leaders, and friends. They may suggest some new things to try.
- 2. Compare your list with the projects described in this guide.
 - Ask yourself if you have the equipment, money, and time to do the projects that sound interesting.
 - *Note: If this is your first year in 4-H, focus on doing only two or three projects well.

4-H leaders . . .

- 1. Make a list of things you are skilled in and/or enjoy doing.
- 2. Compare your list with projects described.
- 3. Select projects that you would like to lead youth in your club with or co-lead with other volunteers.
 - Example: You are a ceramics leader, so select Art project.
- 4. Adult volunteers select your volunteer roll. You will select your club as well.
- 5. To be a certified volunteer in your selected project area, you will need to complete the background check, VIP, Title IX, mandated reporter, and building safe spaces prior to being approved to engage in a volunteer role. Chaperones will be required additional training.
